## PAINT-INS

### APRIL 3rd

Judy Lopez will be teaching Holiday Birds designed by Chris Haughey and the class will be on Zoom.



### MAY 1<sup>st</sup>

Bonnie Dominguez will be teaching USA Ginger designed by Pamela House and interpreted by Bonnie. No cost for instructions. They are below, so be sure to print them before class. This is on a surface of your choice and you can adjust the line drawing accordingly. Class will be on Zoom.

**Palette** – DecoArt Americana Acrylics

Blue Chiffon	Camel	Neon Fiery Red
Burnt Umber	Cocoa	Payne's Grey
Berry Red	Lamp Black	Snow White
Black Plum	Light Mocha	Uniform Blue
Blue Harbor	Milk Chocolate	

**Optional:** Glitter Paint (Sizzling Red, Sapphire Blue)

\*\*\* Use the brushes you are most comfortable with.

\*\*\* **Surface of your choice**, (I used an Ikea bread board) Sand and seal whatever surface your using. Feel free to shrink or enlarge the line drawing as needed.

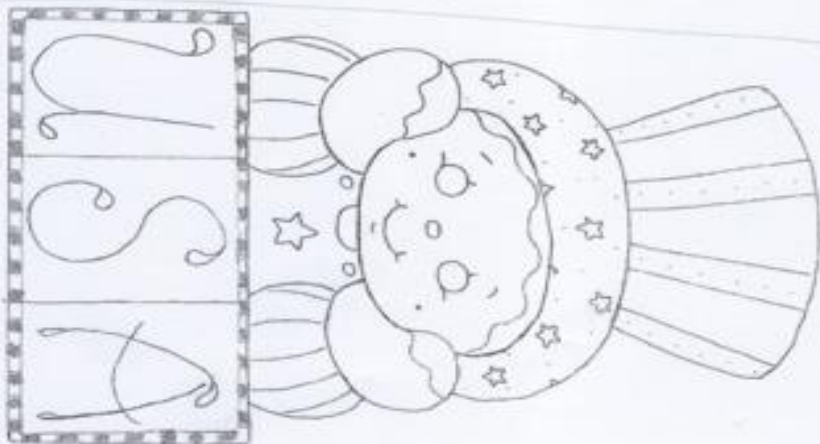
\*\*\*Use whatever background color you like, (I used **Blue Chiffon**) Transfer main pattern lines and base as follows: (**This should be done before class**)

\***Cocoa** – Ginger's Face, Hands and Neck

\***Light Mocha** – White Hat Stripes

\***Berry Red** – Red Hat Stripes, Sleeves, Red Block

\***Uniform Blue** – Blue Shirt, Hat Brim, Blue Blocks



**\*\*\* In class finishing instructions:**

**Shading:**

**\*Ginger's face, hands, and neck** – Shade with Milk Chocolate, deepen with Burnt Umber.

**\*White hat sections** – Shade with Cocoa, deepen with Burnt Umber.

**\*Red hat stripes, sleeves, and red block** – Shade with Black Plum, deepen with Payne's Grey

**\*Blue hat brim, shirt, and blue blocks** – Shade with Payne's Grey

**Highlighting:**

**\*Snow White** – Drybrush the center areas of the white hat stripes.

**\*Camel** – Sideload the top of ginger's hands, and above the chin area.  
Drybrush the center areas of ginger's face and hands.

**\*Neon Fiery Red** – Sideload the right and left sides of the red block.  
Drybrush the center areas of the red hat strips, sleeves, and red Block.

**\*Blue Harbor** – Sideload the top of hat brim.  
Drybrush the center of the hat brim, shirt, and Blue blocks

**Transfer all detail lines on:**

**Details:**

**Gingerbread:**

**Lamp Black** – Eyes, lashes, brows, mouth and chin line

**Burnt Umber** – Shade softly around outside top and sides of eyes, under brows, nose and mouth.

**Berry Red** – Nose, drybrush cheeks.

**Snow White** – Dot and line eyes, nose, dot cheeks, line the icing.

**Burnt Umber** – Shade under icing.

**Camel** – Sideload above the mouth and under the eyes.

**Hat:**

**Snow White** – Line down the center of the red stripes, dots down the center of white stripes, stencil or paint the tiny stars on hat brim.

**Payne's Grey** – Dots in between the stars on the hat brim, Line along the edges of 3 red stripes.

**Berry Red and Uniform Blue** – Float tints on the left and right sides of the hat top.

**Shirt:**

**Lamp Black** – Dot the buttons.

**Snow White** – Lines on the sleeves, stencil or paint the star on his chest and dot the center of the star, highlight dot on buttons.

**Uniform Blue** – Line the cuffs.

**Berry Red** – Line the neckline.

**Blocks:**

**Snow White** – Line the USA letters, washy checks around the blocks (I used a #2 flat).

**Payne's Grey** – Shadow line the right side of letters.

**Berry Red** – Tiny dots in between the washy white checks

Add glitter wherever you like as much as you like.

### Goldfinch Meadow

Cambridge Plaque 6-1/2" x 13-3/8" - Learn how to create the look of verdigris. Create background foliage using Radical Round and stencils. Easy strokes for painting bird, branches, and flowers.



SATURDAY

### Victorian Carolers

Snowglobe Plaque 11-1/2" x 8" - Fill a Christmas snowglobe with holiday song. Stencils used for design, but mostly traditional painting using tips and tricks for the look of intricate detail.

The following is a supply list Chris sent of what you will need to paint the projects. However, you do not need to purchase her brushes unless you want to. You may use the ones you already have as they will achieve the desired effect.

From Chris:

Both classes have some fun background techniques, so I don't trace line drawing until background is completed. I will provide the line drawing on vellum for tracing at the seminar.

### **Goldfinch Meadow:**

Cambridge Plaque 6-1/2 x 13-3/8 \$3.75

Fern Stencil \$4.75

### **Brushes used:**

Angle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Angle  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

Chris's Awesome  $\frac{1}{8}$ " Angle

Oval Wash  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

Splatter Brush

Chris's Spectacular #4 Stencil Brush

Filbert #4, #6, #8

Flat Shader #4, #6

Chris's Epic 18/0 Script Liner

Chris's Radical #5 Round

Script Liner #5/0

Scumbler

### **Prep Instructions:**

Using large Specialty Sponge, seal surface with Multi-Purpose Sealer. Lightly sand and basecoat with Light Buttermilk using same sponge. (It is not necessary to use the sponge. Just seal, sand and base coat as usual with your favorite brush. CJ)

### **Victorian Carolers**

Snowglobe Plaque 11-1/2 x 8-3/4 \$3.75

Joy Label Stencil \$3.75

Woodgrain Stencil \$7.50

I did use Tim Holtz Mini Stencils to add design on the lady's skirt and little girl's dress.

### **Brushes Used:**

Angle- $\frac{1}{4}$ " , -1/2 Angle

Chris's #3, #4, #5 Spectacular Stencil Brush

Chris's Awesome  $\frac{1}{8}$ " Angle

Chris's Epic 18/0 Script Liner

Chris's Radical #5 Round

Filbert #6,

Flat Shader -2

Oval Drybrush #6

Mop - Medium

Oval Wash  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

**Prep Instructions:**

Using large Specialty Sponge, seal surface with Multi-Purpose Sealer and lightly sand. Basecoat surface with Winter Blue using same specialty sponge. (It is not necessary to use the sponge. Just seal, sand and base coat as usual with your favorite brush. CJ)
