The first one is September 18th, Artisan in the Pines, Bev is sharing her space with us. The next sale is Mountain Artist Guild, October 1-3rd. Thank you Marcia for getting us this opportunity. It is a 3 day sale so might be asking for help. November is St. Germaine's, November 13th. I am continuing to build followers to our Facebook Business Page. We've sold a couple of things but needs a lot of work. I was not able to participate in May's Online Market Spot so we will be focusing on patriot and summer items for the June sale. There is a possibility that there will be a Christmas in July sale. Stay tuned, keep painting. Thanks for your support!!!

PAINT-INS

May 22 10:00 am

Pat will teach background prep on the two Chris Haughey seminar pieces for us on May 22 on Zoom at 10am.

You will need to have your piece sealed and the basecoat on. Also, we will be using a hair dryer so have one available. This way we should only need 2 hours or less to have this completed.

JUNE

There is not a paint-in in June because of the Seminar.

JULY

Karen Smith will teach Flower Lady on a surface of your choice. There is no instruction cost. Here are the prep instructions and line drawing.

Flower Girl (formerly “Sewing Box” girl)
Designed by Sandra Malone, taught by Karen Smith 2021

Prep instructions:

The design covers approximately 9x12 area; I decided to paint on a round circle board that I had. You may use the surface of your choice. Sand smoothly, seal, sand again; wipe to remove particles.

Basecoat the background with Delta Purple Smoke if you have it. Substitute DecoArt color mix would be 2 parts Grape Juice + 3parts Neutral Grey. Mix enough to paint the background and have extra for touchup if needed (save it in a cubby). You can substitute a different coordinating background color if you wish. You may tape off the edge and apply black and white checks if you wish.

Trace the outline of the girl onto your surface. If you wish to paint the diamond ‘quilted’ look: trace that on lightly. The diamonds are formed with shading/highlighting. Float a large shadow on them with your background color + charcoal in the bottom of the diamonds. Drybrush a faint highlight at the upper half of the diamonds with Wisteria. Test your color; if that’s too bright, add some deep midnight blue to it. Stitching is done with deep midnight + wisteria, using a thin liner in a casual manner. The diamonds just fade away to the outside so it’s a soft background look.

Shade widely but softly around all of the girl/hat with a mix of Charcoal plus background mix before painting the design and then add additional shading after painting the design if needed.

DecoArt colors: You may substitute colors that you have or similar colors. If you have a supply of Delta colors Sandra used them.

Antique gold	Fleshtone/warm beige	Neutral grey
Black green	Frosted plum	Oyster beige
Burnt sienna	Grape Juice	Red violet
Cadmium orange	Hauser Green light	Shading flesh
Charcoal	Hauser Green medium	Tangerine
Country red	Honey brown	White
Deep burgundy	Light buttermilk	Wisteria
Deep periwinkle	Marigold	
Deep midnight blue	Medium flesh	

Basecoat: apply pattern without details.

Face: fleshtone

Ribbon: I chose pink (country red + white)

Hat: this is a sheer looking hat, not solidly basecoated! Wash on the hat with a mix of Deep Periwinkle + white + water. Add light buttermilk to your brush and brush across the area over her eyes (one layer only). Even if it looks choppy, it will be fine.

Tuxedo bib: Light buttermilk; paint right across buttons. Collar is white

Orange flower: tangerine or cad orange, center antique gold

Blue flower: deep periwinkle, center marigold

Purple flower: frosted plum, center frosted plum

Rose: loosely base country red

Tulips: base in same pink

Leaves: Hauser green light



Reapply pattern details to surface as needed.



AUGUST

Pat Kaminsky will teach The Funky Chicken designed by Linda Sharp.

I am aware that this piece will not be taught until August but if you are going to need a board to paint this project on, you need to let me know as soon as possible. Jody will be ordering the boards. The board Jody will be ordering is approximately 10x15.5" and looks similar to the piece, showing here what needs to be prep for the class. If you want the piece that Linda Sharp painted, you can order it from jbwoods.com, Wood Banner #0527, it is approximately 8.5x15". You can paint this on any surface you may have in your stash. If you are painting this on a round surface, you do not need to do the checks. Call me if you have any questions.

Noted: Linda Sharp did this piece with Deco Art Traditions. If you have these colors please use them. I have converted these colors into Deco Art Americana colors or close to them. Most of the colors are used in the flowers.

Aquamarine: Desert Turquoise

Burnt Sienna

Carbon Black: Lamp Black

Dark Grey: Grey Sky with touch of Lamp black

(Delta: Hippo Grey)

Dioxazine Purple

Hansa Yellow: Primary Yellow with a touch of Light Buttermilk

Light Violet: Equal parts Pansy Lavender & Royal Fushia
Naphthol Red
Naphthol Red Light: Brilliant Red
Quinacridone Violet: Brilliant Red and Royal Fushia
Titanium White
Warm White
Yellow Oxide

So one does not have to mix to many colors, I added
Hauser Light Green
Hauser Dark Green
Yellow Green

Seal the surface, dry and lightly sand
Base coat the entire piece Lamp Black or Carbon Black
Sand lightly and remove dust with a wet paper towel (or you can use a brown paper bag to sand).
Trace the pattern (I use Vellum and make a copy of the pattern) then transfer the design to the surface using white transfer paper. Do this lightly.
Tape off at the molding at the top and the red stripe at the bottom of the panel and base coat both with at least two coats of the Naphthal Red or Brilliant Red.
Tape off the Aquamarine Desert Turquoise stripe under the checkboard on the molding (this is approximately 1/8-1/4") and base coat at least two coats.
